Creative Minnesota is a collaborative effort by most of the statewide arts supporting organizations in Minnesota to provide hard data about Minnesota's cultural field and to improve our understanding of its importance to our quality of life and economy. It is part of a long term endeavor to collect and report data on the creative sector every two years for analysis, education and advocacy.



Arts Advocacy Day at the State Capitol is really important each year as we work to protect the Arts when legislators discuss the state budget and Legacy funding, known as "Arts and Cultural Heritage" funding that provides money to the MN State Arts Board and eleven Regional Arts Councils, including Prairie Lakes Regional Arts Council. The meetings were very successful.

Members of Prairie Lakes and local residents joined

about 1,000 arts advocates from around the state, at the Capitol. The team led by Brenda Byron met with nine legislators from south-central MN. "Your input is important to your legislators, whether it be letters, meetings, phone calls or even a simple email. It's important to make your voice heard", noted Byron.

In FY 2016 Prairie Lakes awarded 201 Grants totaling \$421,125

Here's a summary of Grants awarded:

\$46,000 - McKnight Artist Grants (34 grants)

\$82,015 - State General funds (46 grants)

\$293,110 - Arts and Cultural Heritage (ACH) funding (121 grants)

The four categories of ACH grants and the amounts awarded were:

- (1) Arts Programming/Arts Access \$223,020
- (2) Arts Education \$43,000, which includes school & organization grants and 78 Youth Scholarships of \$300 each.
- (3) Arts & Cultural Heritage Festivals \$16,500
- (4) Legacy Equipment/Facilities grants to arts organizations (3 grants) totaling \$10,590

In FY 2017 All PLRAC Grants will be Online for our Programs.

We have implemented the online Grants Management System from Foundant technologies for all our grant programs! Wow, it has been super busy in the PLRAC office, but we did it.

Goal 3: Allow our Prairie Lakes board members to easily read, comment and score applications in a secure online format.

FY 2017 PLRAC GRANT DEADLINES

July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017

<u>Organizational Grants</u> - Non-profit arts organizations, community groups, schools, or public organizations producing or sponsoring arts activities for their community are eligible. Fundable projects may include: community choirs & bands, dance activities, literary readings, music presentations, theatre productions, visual arts classes and exhibitions, etc. Maximums for the Arts & Cultural Heritage grants vary as well as matching fund requirements; check guidelines for details. **Organizations can only receive one grant per year.**

Artist Grants - Are for specific projects that will enhance your arts career. Applications are online at www.plrac.org.

Arts and Cultural Heritage Grants Deadlines are: Aug. 1 and Feb. 1

1. Arts and Arts Access - Maximum \$8,000.

Proposals are for **arts programming** by an organization; defined as maintaining on-going arts programs and services, and offering new and different activities; and equipment that enhances the artistic capabilities of the organization. **Equipment** may include office equipment and software, instruments, risers, theater lighting, theater curtains, sound system, display cases, etc. This also includes **public art**, sculpture, murals, etc; and activities that plan to reach **new audiences** such as youth, ethnic groups, senior citizen groups, etc. and engage the public in new ways. A 50% cash match is required.

2. ACH Arts Education:

There are three categories of support.


A. Schools – Maximum \$4,000. This is available to all public or private non-parochial elementary, middle or secondary schools (K-12) in the nine county area. Grants may fund Artist residencies, live art performances, mini-workshops or arts related field trips. A 10% cash match is required for schools.



B. Non-profit and Community Groups – \$4,000

C. Youth Scholarship for Students (7-12) – \$300, and grades (3-6) - \$200. Students have the opportunity to study their chosen art with a practicing professional artist, take lessons, attend an arts workshop, series of classes, etc. This is for all Art disciplines. Deadline for grades 7-12 is October 1; and grades 3-6 is November 1.

3. ACH Arts & Music Festivals - Maximum \$5,000. For arts and music festivals and activities that represent diverse ethnic and cultural arts traditions. A 50% cash match is required.



Small Arts Project Grants

Non-profit arts organizations, community groups, or public organizations producing or sponsoring arts activities for their community are eligible. These are matching grants up to \$2,000 and may not exceed 75% of the project cost. Fundable activities include: community bands, choirs, theatre events, dance activities, literary readings, visual arts exhibitions and classes, etc. **Deadline: 1st of each month.**

Arts-In-Education Grants

Grants are for **public and private schools**. Matching grants up to \$2,000 are available to fund Artist residencies, live art performances, mini-workshops or arts related field trips. **Deadline: 1st of each month.**

Individual Artist Grants

These McKnight Artist Grants are for specific projects that contribute directly to an Artists growth and professional development in dance, music, theater or visual art. Funds may be used for matting and framing, equipment, attending a workshop, studio time, or studying with a mentor, etc. Deadlines are:

September 15 - Professional Mid-Career Artist Grant, \$3.000 each.

Jan. 15 - Artist Career Development Grant, \$1,000 each.






