Artists: Do you need funds to create new work? We can help!

Artist Development Grants of \$1,500 are Available.

Prairie Lakes will be continuing the \$1,500 Artist Development Grant program in FY 2022. This will allow more artists to apply for funding and will provide more flexible support. Applications are encouraged from artists in all art disciplines. This may include dance, literature, media arts, music, theater, visual art, folk and traditional arts, etc.

The Artist Development Grant of \$1,500 has a deadline of September 1, 2021, with the earliest starting date of October 1, 2021. *The application will be available online by July 1st.*

This \$1,500 project grant provides financial support to artists committed to advancing their work and careers. Artists at all stages of development are eligible. Artists may expand their present work, advance in skill or technique, or move in a new direction.

Applicants must have resided in Blue Earth, Brown, Faribault, LeSueur, Martin, Nicollet, Sibley, Waseca, or Watonwan County for a minimum of twelve months prior to application.

This grant is for a specific project that contributes directly to your growth and development as a professional. Funds may be used for art supplies, materials, equipment, mentorships, workshops, creative time, living expenses, etc.

PLRAC launches a new Website!

The three Prairie Lakes staff members attended several Digital Arts Workshops in fall 2020 and spring 2021, every month for seven months by Adam Reinwald, and Open Voices, LLC. <u>In April 2021 we began conversations with our individual consultant about How Prairie Lakes Could Improve Our Online Presence.</u> We started with small improvements to Facebook posts and our YouTube channel. Next, we were ready to update our twenty-year-old website, and created a new site using the website software Squarespace. We have been working with our current Webmaster to create our new site and launch it to coincide with the New Fiscal Year which begins July 1, 2021.

What Motivates Us When We Think Of Building Our Online Presence And Website?

- We would like Prairie Lakes information to look Professional in How it is Presented Online.
- We want to create a new Vibrant website format that is Up-To-Date, Easy to Navigate, and Accessible.
- We want to create new Videos that provide an Overview of the Artist and Organization grants we offer.

Prairie Lakes hired Triple Falls Productions in Mankato to create some videos for us. The purpose is to develop videos that can be used to promote our Artist grant and Organizational grant programs. Our current goal is to promote the availability of our Artist Development Grant of \$1,500 which is due September 1st.

Videotaping and production began in May and Brenda Byron, Executive Director participated in the videotaping sessions along with other artists Bryan Holland, Dana Sikkila and Jaci Ullrich, in various art locations and at the Arts Center of Saint Peter.

In addition, Triple Falls Productions, Mankato did a Podcast interview with Brenda Byron about Prairie Lakes, and our artist grant program at the end of April.

FY 2022 Arts and Cultural Heritage Grant

Deadlines are: Aug. 1 and Feb. 1

Prairie Lakes Regional Arts Council will fund projects from non-profit tax-exempt 501c3 arts organizations or those using a fiscal sponsor that are producing or sponsoring an arts activity in dance, literature, media arts, music, theater, visual art, folk and traditional art. This includes arts and music festivals, community bands and choirs, theatre events, dance activities, literary readings, public art, visual arts exhibitions and classes, etc. **No specific cash match is required.**

ACH Large Arts Organization Stability Grant. Arts Programming and Access – maximum request \$13,000. Eligibility: They must be a 501c3 Arts Organization that has year-round arts programming, has paid staff, and owns their building (or have a yearly lease for performance space).

<u>ACH Arts Project Grant</u>. Arts Programming and Access – maximum request \$8,000.

Funds may be used for Arts programming that is in-person or virtual. Expenses may include artist fees, artist travel, salaries, equipment, technology, training, promotion, monthly rent (lease payments) and utilities.


ACH Arts & Music Festivals Grant. Maximum request \$6,000. For non-profit tax-exempt 501c3 arts organizations that are sponsoring arts/music festivals and activities that represent diverse ethnic and cultural arts traditions.

ACH Education Grant. Maximum request \$6,000. For arts education programs by non-profit community groups and schools. This may include arts classes, author reading, artist residencies, live art performances, mini-workshops, or arts related field trips for schools.

ACH Youth Scholarship.

Youth Scholarship for Students (grades 7-12) – \$300, and (grades 3-6) - \$200. Students have the opportunity to study their chosen art with a practicing professional artist by taking lessons over a period of months. This is for all Art disciplines. Deadline for grades 7-12 is October 1; and grades 3-6 is November 1.





Small Arts Project Grant

Non-profit arts organizations, community groups, or public organizations producing or sponsoring arts activities for their community are eligible. The grant may be up to \$2,000. BIPOC projects can apply for up to \$3,000. Fundable activities include: arts and music festivals, community bands and choirs, theatre events, dance activities, literary readings, public art, visual arts exhibitions and classes, etc. **Deadline:** July 1, and the 1st of each month until May.

School Arts Project Grant

Grants are for schools K-12 public and private. Grants up to \$2,000 are available to fund Artist residencies, live art performances, mini-workshops or arts related field trips. Deadline: July 1, and the 1st of each month until May.

Artist Development Grant \$1,500

Artist Grants are for a specific project that contributes directly to their artistic growth and professional development in dance, literature, media arts, music, theater, visual art, folk and traditional art. Funds may be used for supplies, matting and framing, equipment, attending a workshop, studio time, studying with a mentor, artist time, and/or living expenses.

Deadline: **September 1**Earliest start date: October 1

The applicant or organization must have an address and provide arts programming within the Prairie Lakes region; the counties are: Blue Earth, Brown, Faribault, LeSueur, Martin, Nicollet, Sibley, Waseca, or Watonwan County.

FY 2022 PLRAC GRANT DEADLINES

July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022

<u>Organizational Grants</u> - Non-profit arts organizations, community groups, schools, or public organizations producing or sponsoring arts activities for their community are eligible. Fundable projects may include: community choirs & bands, dance activities, literary readings, music presentations, theatre productions, visual arts classes and exhibitions, folk and traditional art, etc. Maximums for the Arts and Cultural Heritage grants vary, please check guidelines for details.

<u>Organizations can only receive one grant per year</u>. We encourage arts projects for BIPOC arts and cultural activities and underserved populations.

Artist Grants - Are for specific projects that will advance your work and arts career.

Applications are online at www.plrac.org. Funds are exhausted for all FY 2021 programs.

Artists: Do you need funds to create new work?

Prairie Lakes will continue to offer Artist Development Grants at \$1,500 in FY 2022. The deadline is September 1st and we anticipate that 33 individual artists can be awarded funds, totaling \$49,500. Funds are provided by the McKnight Foundation, noted Brenda Byron, Executive Director.

We encourage Artists to think about applying. To get you started, here are a few of the questions in the online application:

- 1. <u>Project Description</u>. Describe the project you will carry out with the grant funds. Provide as much detail as possible, including what, where and when. Provide details about the timeline associated with the project.
- 2. Describe Your Career As An Artist (Past Experience)
- 3. <u>Describe Where You Are Now as an Artist</u> (Present Experience)

- 4. <u>Describe Your Career Goals as an Artist</u> (Future Experiences)
- 5. <u>How Is This Project Going To Help in Your Career Development?</u>
- 6. <u>Artist Statement</u>. An artist statement is text that accompanies and explains the artist's intentions of their body of work.

The following documents are also needed:

- Artistic Resume
- Work Samples
- Work Sample Description Page

More details are on page 6 about the artist survey that was completed in February 2021. This information was used to plan for our FY 2022 Artist Grant Program.

February 2021 Artist Survey Results

The feedback Prairie Lakes received from the February 2021 Artist Survey was taken into consideration in keeping the grant size at \$1,500 for FY 2022, noted Brenda Byron, Executive Director. Artist's overwhelmingly chose the \$1,500 grant size with 77% of respondents selecting this option. The board noted they will evaluate this grant size again in one year and may consider changes for FY 2023.

Here are some details from the Artist Survey:

1. At What Level or Category are you as an Artist?

38% Established Professional Artist, 26% Arts Educator,

20% Identified themselves as an Emerging Artist,

13% Hobbyist and 3% Crafts person.

2. What arts discipline do you primarily work in?

51% Visual Art, 14% Instrumental Music, 14% Literature, 10% Theater, 4% Vocal Music, 4% Dance, and 1% Media Arts.

The 2021 Artist survey was completed by 69 individuals and details were discussed at the regular board meeting on 2/25/21. The purposes for the survey were to confirm preferences for the artist Grant Size in FY 2022-23, and two scenarios were available to either continue with the \$1,500 grant size, which was a COVID response style grant and amount; or to return to the FY 2020 style of grants with two different amounts and deadlines (\$3,000 & \$1,000 size grants). Artist's overwhelmingly chose the \$1,500 grant size with 77% of respondents selecting this option.

The secondary purpose of the survey was to ask Artists what Barriers they have when Applying for an Artist Grant. This is in direct correlation to our PLRAC Equity and Inclusion meetings, and information reviewed with our new Prairie Lakes Equity Taskforce community members that met in winter and spring 2021.

The respondents were asked to identify Barriers that they have when Applying for an Artist Grant. A total of 64% of the artists that participated in the survey, said that they do not have any barriers to participate when applying for an Artist Grant.

- The highest barrier at 18% was I am too busy trying to make a living and it consumes all my time;
- The second barrier at 16% was I do not have the personal time to devote to my work right now;
- The third barrier was I do not have work samples ready to submit with my application;
- The fourth barrier was that artists did not have a resume ready to submit, and;
- Fifth the Artists stated: "I lack the confidence to write a grant, and so I did not apply".

The restriction on frequency of the artist grant for FY 2022 (not eligible again if received in FY 2021), came directly from Artist comments in the survey.

Several individuals had these comments: It seems the same artists get funded year after year. I think there should be a limit on number of grants, so more artists can be funded. I appreciate PLRAC funding artists who are struggling financially. I also appreciate your attempt to fund artists from throughout the nine-counties. Try to give grants to artists that have never received a grant before, not the same artists over and over again.

Prairie Lakes Updated our Mission and Value Statements in 2021

The Prairie Lakes board met several times in 2020 to discuss updates to their Mission Statement and Value Statements. It has been a few years since the mission statement has been revised. Since we were doing planning for FY 2022-23 it seemed like a good time to revisit this topic. Members provided information and feedback about the need to simplify the mission statement and to create some new value statements that would clarify the different categories we are trying to address through our arts grant programs and services. We were pleased with the outcome and everyone was comfortable with the updated information, which was approved at the January 2021 board meeting.

Mission Statement

The Prairie Lakes Regional Arts Council serves the artistic communities of the 9-county area of southcentral MN by supporting the creation and presentation of diverse art forms, fostering equitable access to arts opportunities, and integrating arts and culture to enhance quality of life in our communities.

We value: The Arts, Artistic Merit, Creativity, Community, Accessibility, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion.



Value Statements:

The PLRAC Equity Taskforce Members Concluded their Meetings in April 2021.

The Prairie Lakes Equity Taskforce meetings concluded in April and we are thankful to the six community members that participated. It should also be noted that three members of the Executive Committee participated in these five meetings and were considered as members of the Taskforce. In addition, the three Prairie Lakes staff members participated, and minutes were compiled for each meeting.

It was nice to get to know these individuals and discuss equity and inclusion topics.

We really appreciated their time to learn about our non-profit organization and make suggestions on how Prairie Lakes can adjust our systems and processes to identify barriers that underserved communities have in participating with us.

Prairie Lakes was able to create more inclusive language in our grant application guidelines based upon suggestions from the group. More importantly,

we learned more about listening and hearing how others perceive our organization.

We have made some small steps forward on our journey of understanding how our organization can be more inclusive in our programming, and these individuals were part of that journey.



In FY 2021 Prairie Lakes awarded 196 Grants totaling \$387,239

Here's a summary of Grants awarded:

\$52,500 - McKnight Artist Grants (35 grants)

\$79,309 - State General funds (24 grants) Small Arts Project & School Grants

\$255,430 - Arts and Cultural Heritage (ACH)

(137 grants); 29 organizational grants & 108 Youth Scholarships.

The three categories of **ACH grants** and the amounts awarded were:

- (1) Arts Programming/Arts Access \$213,552, which includes grants to 27 nonprofit arts organizations and community groups, for their arts programs and activities.
- (2) Arts Education \$41,878, which includes 2 school grants and 108 Youth Scholarships of \$300 or \$200 each.
- (3) Arts & Cultural Heritage Festivals \$0; most community festivals were cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since a primary function of the Council is to serve as a panel for arts project applications, members are chosen for their knowledge, expertise, and involvement in the arts in the areas of dance, literature, media arts, music, theater, visual art, folk and traditional art.

Volunteer board members serve a three year term. Monthly evening meetings are typically held the fourth Thursday of the month in Mankato, at Bethany Lutheran College. The monthly meetings have been conducted as

online meetings this year and will continue virtually until further notice. Attendance at several PLRAC funded arts events per year is required and board members are reimbursed for their mileage to meetings and arts events.


