Professional Mid-Career Artist Grant for \$3,000

Application Deadline: October 1st

This \$3,000 project grant provides financial support to artists committed to advancing their work and careers. Artists may expand their present work, advance in skill or technique, or move in a new direction. They can apply for a specific project that contributes directly to their growth and development as a professional.

Applications are encouraged from artists in all art disciplines, and this may include dance, literature, media arts, music, theater, visual art, folk and traditional art. Artists must have resided in Blue Earth, Brown, Faribault, Le Sueur, Martin, Nicollet, Sibley, Waseca, or Watonwan County for a minimum of six months prior to application.

Youth Scholarships available for students, grades 3-12

Application Deadline: November 1st



\$300 for grades 7–12 \$200 for grades 3–6

These scholarships will provide students the opportunity to study their chosen art with a practicing professional artist, attend an arts workshop, series of classes or special training opportunity.

Students in grades 7–12 must be participating with an instructor, an organization or arts discipline for at least two years to be eligible. Students in grades 3–6 must be participating for at least one year to be eligible. Artistic areas include dance, literature, media arts, music, theater, visual art, folk and traditional art.

These scholarships are for students that are active and excelling in their art form; and are being rewarded for their goals, ambitions, and achievement. The on-going learning component of the lessons, classes, etc. is an important factor. Students need to reside in Blue Earth, Brown, Faribault, Le Sueur, Martin, Nicollet, Sibley, Waseca, or Watonwan County

Arts and Cultural Heritage Grants Awarded A total of \$197,925 was awarded to 26 Area Organizations

The grants are for arts activities in all artistic disciplines. A variety of activities including instrumental and vocal music concerts, theater and dance performances, exhibitions, literary readings, festivals, and classes for youth and adults are being funded. This fund was created by the people of Minnesota to support the arts and preserve our heritage. The Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment, passed by the voters in Nov. 2008, created new resources for land conservation, water conservation, parks and the Arts. The next ACH Grant deadline is January 1, 2024. Organizations and schools can apply once per year for this grant.

Arts Center of Saint Peter - \$9,000. They will provide educational classes including clay, sewing, and literature; and sponsor the Pageant & Singalong Nation music group to support newcomers. Funds will be used for artist fees, supplies, salaries, and facility costs.

Blue Earth Valley Concert Association - \$9,000. They will sponsor their 2023-24 subscription series of music concerts at the Blue Earth Area Schools Performing Arts Center, September 2023-April 2024. Funds will be used for artist fees.

<u>Fairmont Opera House - \$9,000</u>. They will present their 2023-24 season of high-quality performances and events. Funds will be used to pay the performance and administrative fees for the Mankato Symphony Orchestra and vocalists from the Minnesota Opera to perform "Selections from the Messiah", December 17, 2023.

Good Thunder Reading Series - \$9,000. They will present their 2023-24 season of visiting literary artists and events. Funds will be used to pay the honoraria for two artists, Edurado C. Corral in February and Ngozi Ukazu in March.

La Grande Bande, Gaylord - \$9,000. They will present their concert season of Baroque and Romantic era music, September 2023 through May 2024. They will also conduct multiple masterclass sessions with students, host open rehearsals and pre-concert talks, and outreach concerts for those not able to physically attend a season concert. Funds will be used for artist fees, publicity, and rental fees.

<u>Lafayette Band - \$3,300</u>. They will continue to present their summer concerts. Funds will be used to purchase new music and supplies to conserve and facilitate future use of their current music library, and to pay travel stipends, and publicity.

Mankato/North Mankato ACT on Alzheimer's - \$9,000. They will sponsor the Singing Hills Chorus, a singing group made up of people with Alzheimer's disease or related dementias and their care partners. They facilitate two chorus sessions and concerts, one in the fall and one in the spring. They also offer free monthly Summer SingAlongs. Funds will be used for artist fees, salaries, rental fees, and publicity.

Mankato Area Youth Choirs - \$6,000. The choirs, consisting of students in grades 1-12, will hold weekly rehearsals and present two concerts in the fall and spring of 2023-24. Funds will be used to pay stipends to the directors and accompanist.

Mankato Area Youth Symphony Orchestra - \$6,500. They will present multiple concerts during the year with many opportunities for students to participate. Funds will be used for the 2024 Summer Session and will include scholarships, director salaries, venue rentals, and music.

Mankato Makerspace - \$9,000. They will sponsor the "Makerspace Artists of Tomorrow" project, which is a program of weekly youth art classes for students in grades 6-12, September 2023 through June 2024. Funds will be used for artist stipends, salaries, supplies, and facility costs.

Martin Co. Preservation, Assoc. (Red Rock Center for the Arts) - \$9,000. They will sponsor their 2023-24 season of arts programming; including the Musical Lunch program; arts classes; and musical concerts including folk musician Dan Rodriquez, pianist Glenn Henriksen, and vocalists Paul and Kristin Johnson. Funds will be used for artist fees, salaries, and publicity.

Merely Players Community Theatre - \$9,000. They will present their 2023-2024 season of plays in Mankato, including: "Junie B. in Jingle Bells, Batman Smells!", "Agatha Christie's And Then There Were None", and "Aristocats" held at Lincoln Community Center and "9 to 5 the Musical" at the Pond on Madison. Funds will be used for artist fees, publicity, and expendable supplies.

Minnesota New Country School - \$6,000. They will provide ten art and cultural field trips for students during the 2023-24 school year to promote life-long appreciation of all art forms. Activities are divided among several grade levels and include Minneapolis Institute of Arts, Children's Theater, Guthrie Theater, Stages Theater, Ordway Theater, History Theater, Franconia Sculpture Park, Walker Art Center, and a tour of Southern Minnesota Art Galleries. They will also host Prairie Fire Children's Theatre. Funds will be used for artists fees and ticket costs.

Minnesota Valley Chorale - \$9,000. They will perform four concerts in Mankato for the 2023-2024 season; two winter concerts in November and two spring concerts in April. Funds will be used for artist fees, membership scholarships, salaries, supplies, and venue rental.

Musicorum, Mankato - \$9,000. They will present their choral season in Mankato with a holiday concert in December 2023 and a spring concert in April 2024. Funds will be used for the director's salary, instrumentalist stipends, publicity, venue rental, and to purchase music scores.

New Ulm Figure Skating Club - \$8,000. They will present their 2024 Ice Skating Show "Skating to Infinity and Beyond" in March 2024. Funds will be used for salaries, supplies, and ice time rental.

<u>Prairie Winds Middle School Orchestra, Mankato - \$4,000</u>. They will sponsor an artist residency with Mary Carlson Zuehlke and Liz Draper to work with beginning orchestra students, September 2023 through March 2024. Funds will be used for artist fees.

Project G.E.M. - \$9,000. The Growth, Experience & Motivation Project will provide arts education program activities to at risk youth, ages 6-19, in Blue Earth and Nicollet Counties in 2023-24. This includes instruction in art, music, and drama in a variety of locations, taught by college students going in the education field. Funds will be used for artist fees, travel expenses, salaries, and supplies.

<u>ProMusica Minnesota - \$9,000</u>. They will host their series of three chamber music concerts in New Ulm.

"Heart Throbs" on October 15, 2023; "1930s Russia & America" on February 11, 2024; and "Cello Portraits" on April 7, 2024. Funds will be used for artist fees.

St. Clair Public School, Instrumental Music - \$6,000. They will provide an artist residency with percussion specialist, Michelle Roche. She will work with the 5th and 6th grade general music students and the 7th-12th grade concert band students. Funds will be used for artist fees and supplies.

South Central Service Cooperative - \$9,000. They will host the Young Writers & Artists Conference March 5-6, 2024 for students in grades 3-8, at Bethany Lutheran College, Mankato. Students can participate in a variety of subjects related to writing and creative arts. Funds will be used for artist stipends and student scholarships.

Springfield Community Theatre - \$4,000. They will partner with Springfield Community Education and present the musical, "Footloose", November 17-19, 2023. Performances will be held at the Springfield School's performing arts auditorium. Funds will be used for artist fees and equipment.

<u>\$9,000</u>. They will present their 2023-24 season including a Latin music performance and workshop by Alma Andina in September, theater performances of "The Christmas Express" in December, and Chase & Ovation's Prince tribute in May. Funds will be used for artist fees.

<u>Tri-City United Community Education - \$6,000</u>. They will start a middle school drama program that will give students an opportunity to rehearse and perform on stage. They will also sponsor performances of "The Nutcracker" by the Youth Dance Ensemble and School of Burnsville, for grades K-5 in December. Funds will be used for artist fees, director fees, salaries and supplies.

<u>Waseca Arts Council - \$9,000</u>. They will sponsor multiple exhibitions including the Stitchers in Time Quilters Guild, the WAC Members Show, and exhibits by individual artists. They will also host week long Summer Art Camps in June, July, and August for youth. Funds will be used for instructor fees and art supplies.

<u>Waseca- Le Sueur Regional Library System -</u> <u>\$4,125.</u> They will collaborate with Cow Tipping Press and Open Arts Minnesota to sponsor literary and theater arts workshops for 10 adults with developmental disabilities in the Waseca area. The classes will culminate with book publication and a community reading event. Funds will be used for instructor fees.

The Small Arts Project Grant is available to non-profit arts organizations and community groups sponsoring arts activities for their community. School Arts Project Grants are for public or private non-parochial schools K-12 for artist residencies, arts presentations, & arts related field trips.

Three Small Arts Project and School Arts Project Grants Awarded in August

Our Small Arts Project and School Arts Project Grant program funds non-profit arts organizations, community groups, public organizations, or schools producing or sponsoring arts activities for their community or students. We encourage applications for artistic performances or the sponsorship of quality arts activities in the 9-county region. This may include dance, literature, media arts, music, theater, visual art, folk and traditional art, etc.

GSR Fine Art Festival - \$2,500. They will host the art festival to provide artists a regional venue to sell their goods during the holiday season. The festival will be held November 25-26, 2023, at the Mayo Clinic Health System Event Center in Mankato. Musicians will also play throughout the two-days. Funds will be used for artist fees and rental fees.

Hermann Monument Society - \$2,500. They will sponsor HermannFest with ethnic music, speeches, and songs celebrating German heritage and the Hermann Monument in New Ulm, September 9, 2023. Events will be held at Hermann Heights Park and Harman Park throughout the day. Funds will be used for artist fees, publicity, and rental fees.

<u>Waterville-Elysian-Morristown Community Education - \$2,500</u>. They will sponsor Storybook Theatre to work with students in grades 1-9 to present their own theater production, September 25-30, 2023. Funds will be used for artist fees.

FY 2024 Arts and Cultural Heritage Grant

Deadlines are: August 1 and January 1

Prairie Lakes Regional Arts Council will fund projects from non-profit tax-exempt 501c3 arts organizations or those using a fiscal sponsor that are producing or sponsoring an arts activity in dance, literature, media arts, music, theater, visual art, folk and traditional art. This includes arts and music festivals, community bands and choirs, theatre events, dance activities, literary readings, public art, visual arts exhibitions and classes, etc. **No cash match is required.**

<u>ACH Arts Project Grant.</u> Arts Programming and Access – maximum request \$9,000.

Funds may be used for Arts programming that is in-person or virtual. Expenses may include artist fees, artist travel, salaries, equipment, technology, training, promotion, monthly rent (lease payments) and utilities.


ACH Arts & Music Festivals Grant. Maximum request \$6,000. For non-profit tax-exempt 501c3 arts organizations that are sponsoring arts/music festivals and activities that represent diverse ethnic and cultural arts traditions.

ACH Education Grant. Maximum request \$6,000. For arts education programs by non-profit community groups and schools. This may include arts classes, author reading, artist residencies, live art performances, mini-workshops, or arts related field trips for schools.

ACH Youth Scholarship.

Youth Scholarship for Students (grades 7-12) – \$300, and (grades 3-6) - \$200. Students have the opportunity to study their chosen art with a practicing professional artist by taking lessons over a period of months. This is for all Art disciplines. Deadline for both age groups is November 1.





Small Arts Project Grant

Non-profit arts organizations, community groups, or public organizations producing or sponsoring arts activities for their community are eligible. The grant may be up to \$2,500. BIPOC projects can apply for up to \$4,000. Fundable activities include: arts and music festivals, community bands and choirs, theatre events, dance activities, literary readings, public art, visual arts exhibitions and classes, etc. **Deadline: July 1, and the 1st of each month until April.**

School Arts Project Grant

Grants are for schools K-12 public and private. Grants up to \$2,500 are available to fund Artist residencies, live art performances, mini-workshops or arts related field trips. Deadline: July 1, and the 1st of each month until April.

Individual Artist Grants

Artist Grants are for a specific project that contributes directly to their artistic growth and professional development in dance, literature, media arts, music, theater, visual art, folk and traditional art. Funds may be used for supplies, matting and framing, equipment, attending a workshop, studio time, studying with a mentor, or artist time.

The applicant or organization must have an address and provide arts programming within the Prairie Lakes region; the counties are: Blue Earth, Brown, Faribault, LeSueur, Martin, Nicollet, Sibley, Waseca, or Watonwan County.

<u>Organizational Grants</u> - Non-profit arts organizations, community groups, schools, or public organizations producing or sponsoring arts activities for their community are eligible. Fundable projects may include: community choirs & bands, dance activities, literary readings, music presentations, theatre productions, visual arts classes and exhibitions, folk and traditional art, etc. Maximums for the Arts and Cultural Heritage grants vary, please check guidelines for details.

Small Arts Project Grant maximum is \$2,500 and BIPOC cultural arts project may request up to \$4,000. PLRAC is interested in receiving new applications for BIPOC cultural activities that engage the public.

Artist Grants - Are for specific projects that will advance your work and arts career.
